





The last Tsar: blood and revolution - special exhibition

We were delighted to host over 40 guests at this fascinating exhibition. Attendees had the chance to meet the exhibition curator, Lottie Dodwell, and also heard from three special guest speakers:

Dr Peter Gill identified the remains of the Romanovs 70 years after they had died, with DNA profiling techniques that are now being used in forensic investigations.

Dr Keith Gomez works on the 1000 genome project. Members of our community with an inherited bleeding disorder are part of this project helping to understand the different genetics of our community. His talk offered a fascinating insight into the future of genetic study.

Luke Pembroke, Youth Ambassador at The Haemophilia Society, spoke about being part of Team B (which the Tsar family were!)
