Dear Prime Minister,

We the undersigned are a wide representative group of campaign groups, affected individuals and other supporters, who are angry at the continued failure of the Government to create a suitable support scheme for people affected by 'the worst treatment disaster in the history of the NHS', treatment with contaminated blood products.

Failures to agree a full and final settlement that compensates people with bleeding disorders and their families for their loss and provides for their needs have been exacerbated by the government continuing to wrongly assert that no mistakes were made and nothing could have been done differently.

Leading clinicians, civil servants and pharmaceuticals companies were aware of the risks posed by pooled blood products, and the heightened risks of those imported from the United States, yet failed to act on this information or communicate those risks to patients.

Government intentions in the 1970s for the UK to become self-sufficient in the production of blood products were not followed through and led to more people being infected with HIV and hepatitis viruses than would otherwise have occurred.

That is why we insist that the Government set up a full UK wide public inquiry, something which has never previously occurred, to compel witnesses under oath, release all documents for public scrutiny and have a remit to consider failures in government policy and negligence by public bodies.

Your predecessor, David Cameron, apologised in March 2015 on behalf of the Government for 'something that should not have happened' and agreed to transparent publication of information on what occurred and proper compensation for the people and families affected by the Scandal. Ultimately this did not occur and the Government is still pushing ahead with an ex-gratia scheme that is insufficiently funded, leaves people worse off and excludes many of those affected.

We demand the Government immediately set up a full Public Inquiry. However, the Government must not make this an excuse to delay or restrict the provision of payments to both the infected and affected community.

We seek your swift response to ensure truth, justice and compensation for all those affected.
